Getting Started:

1. When you hear of bad things happening in other areas of the world or to other people, do you wonder why God doesn't intervene to stop what's happening? What explanation do you give for God's apparent silence or inactivity?

Digging Deeper:

2. Read Daniel 10:1 – 11:1. In 10:5-6, what are the most prominent features of the one whom Daniel sees in his vision?

3. How would you compare the description of the "man dressed in linen" in 10:5-6 with the way Jesus is described in Revelation 1:10-16? What are the similarities and differences?

 Summarize Daniel's response (10:7-9, 15-17) to what he sees and hears. Note both physical and emotional symptoms.

5. What does 10:12 reveal about Daniel? How does this explain his mourning in 10:2-3? What example is there for us here?

6. Often when we pray for something over an extended period of time without seeing any results, we are tempted to stop praying. What are some reasons why we would quit praying? What do the angel's words to Daniel (10:12-14) reveal about God's response to those who seek him?
