4. Paul could have very well been discouraged, having to make this trip at all, given that his imprisonment was unjust (Acts 26:37-38). He might have contemplated expending a lot of effort to be released. How can we know when to get out of a bad situation and when to face it?

5. Even in this terrible mishap, how did God provide for Paul and the rest of the passengers and crew?

6. Where do you see God at work, even in the midst of a difficult set of circumstances?
