- 7. Contrast Abraham's effect on events (18:32, 19:29) with Lot's inability to influence people (19:6-9, 14, 26). How were the two men different? Why do you think his audiences dismissed Lot's words? Is there a lesson here for us?
- 8. What moral does the fate of Lot's wife teach (19:17,26)? Consider Luke 17:31-33.

### Let's Pray:
