4. For Thought and Discussion: The following passages tell us that the resurrected bodies of believers will correspond in some fashion with Christ's resurrected body (1 Cor. 15:47-49; Phil. 3:20-21; 1 John 3:2). Based on what you've learned, how do you think we will be similar to Christ? Dissimilar? Why?
5. Is the idea that *everyone* will be resurrected new or surprising to you? What do you learn about this from the following texts: Acts 24:15; Daniel 12:2; John 5:21,25-29; Romans 2:5-10.
6. Jesus repeatedly warned of hell and judgement against sinners who rejected the mercies of God. For example, read Matthew 13:40-43.
 - a. Reflect: What do you think about hell? Do you believe in it? If not, why not? If so, why?
 - b. If so, what do you think it will be like? How does this make you feel?
 - c. What, if anything, does this parable motivate you to want to do? Why?
